BEWARE of PHONE SCAMS!




In phone scams, tricksters use threats or false claims to get you to part with your hard-earned money. Don't become a victim to such phone scams:

IMPERSONATION SCAMS

Tricksters claim to be government officials and tell you to send money to avoid trouble.

The truth is ...

Government officials will issue you a written notice for official matters and will never require you to send money.



help:

KIDNAR SCAMS.

Tricksters tell you they have kidnapped a family member and demand that you pay money for their release.

The truth is ...

It may be a trick. Call your family members to check and alert the Police immediately.

LOTTERY SCAMS

Tricksters tell you that you have won a lottery or a lucky draw and you need to pay money to process the claims.

The truth is ...

You are unlikely to win a prize in a lottery or a lucky draw in which you have not participated.

- Do not reveal your bank account number or send money to a stranger.
- Provide information on such scams to any Neighbourhood Police Centre/ Post or call the Police Hotline at 1800-2550000.
